# Ash Wednesday – February 18, 2015 Worship at Noon and 7:00p.m.

Lent begins with a solemn call to fasting and repentance as we begin our journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. As we hear in our reading for the Ash Wednesday Service, "Now is the acceptable time to return to the Lord." During Lent we, the people, of God, will reflect on the meaning of our baptism into Christ's death and resurrection.

The sign of ashes, which we receive on this day, suggests our mortality and frailty. What seems like an ending is really an invitation to make each day a new beginning, in which we are washed in God's mercy and forgiveness. With the sign of the cross on our brow, we long for the spiritual renewal that flows from the springtime Easter feast to come.

 $D^{\mathsf{ear}}$  Friends in Christ,

This year the season of Lent begins in February, so my thoughts have already turned in that direction. Truly, Lent is a hard season to sell. It has a bad reputation, and it certainly doesn't fit very well with what many modern people want from religion. In a time when *entertainment* and *worship* are used in the same sentence, it's difficult to understand what Lent has to offer.

The most common images associated with Lent are images that most people seek to avoid in their lives: darkness, mourning, sorrow, and distress. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, the sign of the cross darkening our foreheads, and the somber solemn words ringing in our ears: "*Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."* It ends with Good Friday as our Lord is nailed to the cross and becomes one with us in death. This is definitely **not** worship and entertainment!

But the woe of the cross is not the entirety of Lent. To focus on the cross as the only image of the season is to lose sight of the fullness of God's activity among us. The reality is that we Christians know how this story ends and, because of that, our somber observances contain the seeds of celebration. While the cross is an appropriate focus for our reflections, we always see it not simply as an instrument of torture and death, but as a vehicle of salvation.

So, the tone of Lent is also one of optimism. The first reading on the First Sunday in Lent sounds this note following the Genesis flood, God paints a rainbow in the sky, a sign of God's presence and promise, and life goes on with that assurance. Sunday after Sunday the same theme is presented. A promise is made to Abraham, even though he is apparently too old for it to be kept. Fiery serpents bring death to a disobedient people, but God sends healing – a bronze serpent raised on a pole and, ultimately, Christ on the cross. God rescues his people from their bondage in Egypt and gives them the framework of life in relationship with God and with one another.

Throughout the season, we are reminded that our God has established a covenant, a relationship of love, with us that no force, including sin and death can ever overcome. On the Fifth Sunday in Lent, Jesus speaks of a grain dying in the earth as an image of his death and resurrection. Christ is the seed fallen to earth, a planting that yields a harvest of life, health, and salvation. Christ is the one who accompanies us in our baptismal death and raises us to new life in him.

During the season of Lent our prayer will be that God will create in us clean hearts, that he will cleanse us and make us strong,

# Mindfulness

Some of you may remember the newsletter article I wrote last spring regarding the history of our narthex, in both its previous and its present incarnations. An undeniable salute remains to those who made the choices in the new design, which includes a lofty narthex space which continues to lift the spirits of those who enter. Also mentioned was the worshipful quietness imbued by our sanctuary, also a lofty space, which possesses a palpable sacredness.

Those precious connections between so many within our church community are consistent with our hopes for what a good design can achieve. It is a space for connections, a space for inspiration, a space of respite, study , prayer, and yes, the challenge and hard work of trying to understand the mystery. We are overjoyed to witness the love within these walls; it is obvious wherever in the space that people congregate.



But I mention this for a particular reason, and that is the one thing, the one piece of baggage which all of this ebullience has brought. Pre-worship conversations, often good ones, may not be ready to end at the time that worship convenes, and therein is the rub. If everyone can remember this, regardless of what is happening, and perhaps someone could even hold up their hand and say "timeout," or everyone could simply get up and enter the sanctuary when the music starts (NO LATER than 7:55 or 10:55), then all will be on the same page, and can agree to start up where they left off when they emerge from the sanctuary later.

This is important for all of us, both in respect for our purpose, as well as respect for those who have already quieted themselves for worship. When we think of what brought us here in the first place, our gratitude cannot be overstated.

Refreshments will be served.





#### Christmas Food Basket ... Marian Brown


