

ugust is that month when we are still in the full bloom of summer and sun, even maybe the hottest month of the year, but the turning has already begun. The days are growing shorter, fall is just a little bit off. Summer bring growth, there is still time to grow, but the time is quickly ticking by. I know we wonder if summer is going to last into October or will October truly begin winter. That part is still unknown, we might still have a long summer ahead of us, or it might be quite quickly over. But, is not all of life like that? We are not guaranteed anything, only given the opportunity to make the most of the time we are given. However, August does mark that point in our calendar where we can check our list of what we had hoped to accomplish. There is still time to readjust and reprioritize. The season of growth is still here, but now stand with the finiteness of it's season felt acutely. The youth of our congregation might be starting to make preparations to go back to school. It is still summer but, also we know as the street corner sign use to read, "The end is near." Again we have the opportunity to ponder what do we still wish to accomplish in the time ahead. What growth would we like to see, what is available in the summer that might lead me to connect closer with the divine.

I offer this surfing illustration as a way of example. Just a few years ago, I seemed to be stuck surfing in the white wash after the waves broke, looking at the surfers sitting on their boards past the breaking waves, hopelessly dreaming that I might grow up and be one of them some day. I would watch the most untalented of those out there who were able to catch and ride and I was determined to be like that one. It was not the most advanced surfer that I aspired to be, because I knew my own athletic limitations. I had little hope of ever becoming a Micheal Jordan on the waves. It was the less skilled that was still able to get up and ride that inspired me. Because I knew I could at least achieve that. At the start of summer this year, I set that as one of a few goals in order to have the time to live into what I wanted to be. I postponed some continuing education in the fall, so that I would have the time to live into my personal journey; to be at least one of the less talented people out there, but the one still able to catch and ride the wave. The start of August gives me the chance to ask myself if I have grown into that yet? But more importantly, what accomplishments, while the waves are still manageable, do I want to achieve before swells of fall bring more energy. Is there time to readjust and bring some focus towards the areas that still needs growth.

But none of this is really about suffering or summer vacation. It is really about our encounter with the divine. I wonder if we ask ourselves, how have I grown into my true self during this summer, during this last year, during this last month? Maybe it's an invitation to ask ourselves what might I need to readjust to continue the journey. Life is

#### Classical Trio Returns to Newport ... by Susan Painter

T he ever popular Portland-based Trio Musicorum Medicorum returns to Atonement on Sunday, August 4 to offer a free concert for the community and to benefit the Newport Food Pantry.

The group will join the congregation for the church service and offer music at 10:00 a.m. that morning. The trio will then perform their concert at 3:00 p.m. at the church. Those attending should bring nonperishable food items and/or donations for the Food Pantry to the event.

The trio will perform three works: The Piano Trio in G Major (1880) by Claude Debussy, Gabriel Faure's Piano Trio in D Minor Op 120 (1923) and the Piano Trio No 4 in E Minor, Op 90 (1891) known as "Dumky" by Antonin Dvorak.

The nationally renowned classical group includes Rebecca Reese, cello, Andrew Bonner, piano, and Newport Symphony first violinist Alistair Kok. The group has appeared for several concerts in Newport during the past eight years, most recently in spring, 2023, at the Doerfler Family Theatre of the Pacific Maritime History Center.

In recent years, the trio has regularly performed for Portland's Old Church noontime concert series, private house concerts and many other Portland locations. The group has made guest appearances with the Oregon Coast Youth Strings Festival concerts in Newport.

The group first performed in Newport in 2016 to an enthusiastic audience. The group calls itself "Trio Musicorum Medicorum," because each member has a "day job" in the medical field in the Portland area. Dr. Kok is a dentist, Dr. Bonner is a naturopath, and Dr. Reese is a physician currently specializing in cranial osteopathy and homeopathy.

Although the group has performed together for several years, each musician has an illustrious and extensive individual career.


