I appreciate all your prayers for a fun safe vacation. As always, and you are all very good at respecting my private time, but if there is an emergency feel free to contact me.



Summer on the coast has to be the most beautiful place on earth, It certainly makes up for the rain and cold of the winter and is the sign of the increased traffic on our roadways. Lots of other people think so too! There is something about being near water that draws us. There is a book I have read many times called the Blue Mind by Wallace J Nichols who explores the scientific research that demonstrated the healing power of water on the human psyche. But you don't need to read the book to understand the truth of this. We know that properties with a view of a body of water have increased property value, and the closer to the water you get the higher that premium increases. People are willing to pay increased amounts for a hotel room that faces a body of water, and just how much of our recreational hobbies around the nation deal with water: Fishing, boating, swimming, scuba diving, surfing, canoeing, a hike to a waterfall, along a creek, and I could go on and on! People vacation near their destinations of water, lakes, oceans, rivers. Studies have even shown that works of art that depict water, painting, and photographs that have bodies of water in them are generally favored more than those that do not. I have long tried to find the answer to why this is, and perhaps this will be a lifelong quest to understand the power of water. Perhaps it is because we are mostly water, our planet models this, it is also mostly water, so being near water calls to us, as if it is calling us home. There is a great mystery here, a profound mystery. For me this all returns to our baptism where water is poured over us so that we will know that Christ is in us. If I ever figure out the mystery of water, I will understand the mystery of baptism for at its core, I think we are looking at the same mystery. It is the Spirit brooding over the water in the first chapter of Genesis. Brooding like a mother over her youth, caring, tending, enable life and growth. But the Spirit does this over the water. When we come to the baptismal font it is a symbol of this reality. God the mother is there over water, over us, calling us to a life. We speak of that in our baptism we call it life, salvation, a washing that creates a new creation. While we only do it once rituals, we are called by Luther to return to the promise daily. What is this promise other than the truth of water, it is all around us, it is the source of all

But remember water is in you, you'r mostly water, so whatever we say about a body of water we have to say about ourselves. God is in you, and the Spirit is brooding over you. You are the inner font united to Christ, and there in that mysterious body of water that we call the human body, you are home because in you is where God dwells. I invite you all to a Spiritual practice, go find a body of water, let us say the pacific ocean, but of course it can be any body of water or picture of a body of water, and dwell on the mystery of that water, how deep, powerful, wide, and strong it is, how small human life is compared to that body. Then turn inward to your own body, how deep, powerful, wide, and strong you are, how small we are each compared to the potential that is inside you. Turn back to the body of water, and remember the Spirit is hoovering there, the Spirit beyond any comprehension, then turn once more inwardly and rest in the knowledge that same boundless Spirit is within you. May this meditation lead to contemplation as you sit quietly knowing that

God is with you. "Be still and know that I am God." Psalm 46:10.

Men's Breakfast Group






ALC Book Club ... by Pastor John Smithies
