

he end of August has been a rollercoaster at our house. We drove down to Grant's pass for Karen's memorial, which was a blessing mixed with the sadness of that event. But then on the way back we obtained a new Ferret Maximus, what joy of new life! Then, our female ferret got really really sick and we had to nurse her back to health which with a lot of medication and an IV drip. And yes, that is as horrific as it sounds trying to give a ferret an IV drip that she does not want. Perhaps sometime that story will be in a sermon. It was very scary and stressful, but we offer our thanks that she made a full recovery. At the same time, we were also faced with a hard conversation about Jen's Father who is being moved into hospice care. Your prayers are always appreciated for our family in this time of transition. And then we start September with a lot of hope for the future, we have new members, potential new partnership and projects and yet also a lot of concern for members in our community who might be transitioning away, and other issues that face us. And if that was not all, amidst all that, I have entered a Spiritual Directors training program which will start this month and last for two years. It is all an extracurricular activity for me and will not detract from the work here. This will give me an opportunity to grow myself and give me the skills to help others. I am excited about it as I see it as the next progression, and I do speak about progression a lot sometimes, it is a surfing term. You have to master one skill before learning another. Thanksgiving and sadness, hopes and fears all melded together in one month. Much like going out to surf when the swell is big. There are a lot of ups and downs, moments of triumph with moments of being tumbled by the sea and fear mixed with joy.

September is a month of these contradictions, the growth of summer is still evident, but Fall is now here and with that comes the cold of winter and the long nights. What do we do in the midst of all these contradictions? Sometimes I turn to the book of Philippians where Paul writes, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." I like this passage, because Paul is facing his potential execution, I am sure he has some anxiety about that. It is not a condescending "Don't worry everything will be fine." But a testament that in all our worries and amidst the contradictions we offer them up to God with gratitude. So, the deep peace of the mystery of God might be known in our midst. I am grateful for our little community that does so much and is a light of God's love, I give thanks for all of you for being a part of this journey. And we offer our concerns to God trusting that amidst life God is right here in Christ Jesus redeeming it all. May this be our journey in September God is in our midst in our lives, Christ is here in us, in our community and together we will journey into the fall with Pastor John Smithies hope for what God is doing in our midst.

Please contact me by October 1<sup>st</sup> with answers so we can move forward. Thank you.








#### Hello from the Library Committee




